

# Mozambique 2015 Rates



Dear Client

Here is a breakdown of costs and how the hunts work in Mozambique. It differs from Zimbabwe hunts in that Mozambique require clients to pay up front "The Moz Animal License Fees" for animals that they want. These Animal License Fees are non refundable but the client does have the option of returning before the end of April the following year to hunt for the animals that they have paid for and not shot.

I have learnt that it is better for the client to pay for the key animals that he wants and to bring cash with them to pay Animal License fees for the other animals that he might want to shoot. This avoids the client paying too much upfront.

## WRITE UP ABOUT HUNTING AREAS AND MOZAMBIQUE

I have recently managed to get Two big hunting concessions in Mozambique which border the Gonarezhou National Park (Zimbabwe) and Kruger National Park (South Africa). Each area is about 150 000 acres.

### CROOKS CORNER AREA

This area starts where the three countries meet (South Africa / Zimbabwe / Mozambique) on the Limpopo River. The area borders the Limpopo Transfrontier Park. There are very good Elephant / Buffalo / Lion / Leopard / Hippo and Crocodile. The Elephants come out of Kruger National Park on the Limpopo River into our area. These Elephants / Buffalo and Lion have the Kruger / Gonarezhou National Parks gene pool which are well known for big Ivory / Buffalo and Lion. We have about 60 Kilometres of the Limpopo River which has very good Hippo and Crocodile.

### SAVE AREA

The second hunting area is also 150 000 acres. It has a 26Km boundary with the Gonarezhou National Park and then follows the Save River for about 40 Km. This is a beautiful Area and has very big Elephant/ Buffalo and Lion. It has good Leopard/Hippo and Crocodiles. There is also Plainsgame such as : Nyala / Kudu / Zebra / Waterbuck / Duiker / Steenbok / Hyena etc... This area is very scenic and has very few local people in it. It has a very wide range of animals. It is good throughout the year but it is excellent in February to May and October to 15th December.

## HISTORY OF MOZAMBIQUE

Mozambique was a Portuguese colony for around 400 years. In 1975 Mozambique gained their Independence. Almost immediately a Civil War started which only ended in 1992. Since then they have encouraged foreign investment to rebuild the country. Mozambique is a very big country (about 5 times bigger than England) with a population of only 20 million people. It has vast tracks of land where very few people live. It has a beautiful Coastline (about 2500 km). Many Areas have been opened up for hunting as it was once a famous country for hunting.

## MOZAMBIQUE ANIMAL LICENSE FEES

Mozambique fees are very different than Zimbabwe. The Mozambique Government have a License fee for each animal. This License Fee gets paid to the Government, it is their fee to make something on each animal. They want to be pre paid for important animals such as Elephant / Buffalo / Leopard / Lion / Hippo and Crocodile. These Fees are non refundable. If a client does not shoot a animal which they have paid a License Fee for then they can return before end of April the following year. and hunt for it without paying the License Fee a second time. Here is a List of some of the Animal License Fees:

## GOVERNMENT LEVY

There is a 15% Government Levy charged on all animals shot/wounded. This is 15% of the Government Animal License Fees. This is paid before the hunt and/or at the end of the hunt the Animal License Fees are to be paid for any additional animals that the client shot/wounded during the hunt.

## HUNTING PERMIT ( CARD )

Before the client arrives in Mozambique for their hunt they would have already paid me their Government License Fees. The Government then will give me the clients Hunting Permit. The Government would have stamped the animals in the card that they have paid for. There is a Fee of US\$ 250 per hunter for this Permit (to be paid before the hunt starts).

## RIFLE PERMIT

There is a Fee of US\$ 200 per Rifle (to be paid before hunt starts). The Clients will need to supply the following at least 3 weeks before hunt starts. The Exact Firearm Requirements For the Rifle Permit :

1. Rifle Serial Number
2. Model of Rifle
3. Make of Rifle
4. Calibre of Rifle
5. 4 x Passport Size Photographs
6. Clear Copy of Passport.
7. Full Name of Client
8. Full Address of Client
9. Exact Number of Ammunition.

These details can be scanned to me.

## DETAILS FOR OBTAINING A VISA

On Arrival into Zimbabwe the Clients can buy their Zimbabwe Visa at the Airport. If the client is going onto Mozambique then they must ask for a DOUBLE ENTRY VISA. The cost of the Zimbabwe Visa is about US\$ 30. I will send the client a Invitation Letter.

The Clients must apply for a Mozambican Visa in their Country or they can purchase the Visa at the Chicualacuala Border (Cost is +- US\$ 75)

## DAILY RATES OF SAFARIS

### 12 Day Elephant / Plainsgame Hunt :

Daily Rate (one client : one professional hunter) = US\$ 1 300 per day x 12 Days

Daily Rate (two clients : one professional hunter) = US\$ 1 100 per day x 12 days

### 14 Day Elephant / Buffalo or Elephant / Leopard Hunt :

Daily Rate (1 on 1) = US\$ 1 350 per day x 15 Days

**14 Day Elephant / Buffalo or Elephant / Leopard Hunt :**  
Daily Rate (1 on 1) = US\$ 1 350 per day x 15 Days

**15 Day Elephant / Buffalo / Leopard Hunt :**  
Daily Rate (1 on 1) = US\$ 1 150 per day x 15 Days

**21 Day Elephant / Lion / Buffalo / Leopard Hunt :**  
Daily Rate (1 on 1) = US\$ 1 550 per day x 21 Days

**10 Day Buffalo / Plainsgame Hunt :**  
Daily Rate (1 on 1) = US\$ 900 per day x 10 Days  
Daily Rate (2 on 1) = US\$ 675 per day x 10 Days

**14 Day Buffalo / Leopard Hunt :**  
Daily Rate (1 on 1) = US\$ 1050 per day x 14 Days

**14 Day Leopard Hunt :**  
Daily Rate (1 on 1) = US\$ 950 per day x 14 Days

**18 Day Lion Hunt :**  
Daily Rate (1 on 1) = US\$ 1 500 per day x 18 Days

**Plainsgame Hunt :**  
(1 on 1) = US\$ 675 per day x 10 days  
(2 on 1) = US\$ 540 per day x 10 days

**Observer / Non Hunter Fee :**  
US\$ 200 per day

NOTE : Clients can hunt two Buffalo. The cost of second buffalo = Moz License Fee US\$ 1 000 plus 15% Government Levy US\$ 150 plus the Operator Trophy Fee US\$ 2 100 = TOTAL COST FOR SECOND BUFFALO = US\$ 3 200.

## END OF HUNT PAYMENTS

- Operators Trophy Fees
- Any Outstanding Mozambique Animal License Fees and 15% Government Levy for additional animals shot during the hunt (this is 15% of the Animal License Fees).
- Trophy Transportation Fee is US\$ 500 per client (From hunting Concession to shipping Agent in Mozambique).
- Road Transport from Harare to Mozambique Hunting Area = US\$ 1 600 per vehicle.
- Gratuities.

## DAILY RATE INCLUDE

- Accommodation, laundry service, meals, drinks & beverages.
- Licensed Professional Hunter.
- Hunting Vehicle.
- Skinners / Trackers.
- Field Preparation of trophies.
- Hunting Licenses.

## DAILY RATES EXCLUDE

- Transport to and from Harare Airport (Zimbabwe) or Maputo Airport (Mozambique).
- Hotel in Harare or Maputo.
- Air Charters & Commercial flights whilst on Safari.
- Any expenses incurred before & after the safari.
- Trophy Fees.
- Taxidermist fees, shipment of trophies & personal items.
- Mozambique Animal License Fees & 15% Government Levy (15% of Total Animal License Fees).
- Safari video (if required).
- Gratuities.
- Rifle Permits.
- Hunting Permit (Card).

## TERMS OF BUSINESS

- A 50% Deposit of the Total Daily Rate & Observer Fees is required to book the safari and the balance 50% to be paid 30 days before hunt starts.
- Mozambique Animal Permits and Rifle Permits to be paid 60 days before hunt starts and are Non Refundable.
- Temporary Import/Export firearms permit is necessary if travelling through South Africa with Firearms to Mozambique.
- All Payments can be paid in cash and also Bank Wire Transfers.
- All Wounded Animals will be charged for at full trophy fee & License Fee and 15% Government Levy.

## NOTES

- Baits will be charged at the Full Mozambique License Fee plus 50% of the Trophy Fee.
- Elephant Ivory cannot be imported into the USA from Mozambique.
- Malaria preventatives are necessary and clients should consult their physician.
- Medical : Global Rescue ([www.globalrescue.com](http://www.globalrescue.com)).
- Hippo cannot be exported until further notice.

## TRAVEL

There are several options to travel to hunt in Mozambique.

- To fly to Harare Airport (Zimbabwe). We will collect clients and drive to our Naivasha camp (7 Hour drive). We will overnight at Naivasha camp and the following morning cross the border into Mozambique and drive to hunting camp (4 hour drive).
- To fly to Maputo Airport (Mozambique). Someone will meet clients and take to Hotel to overnight. The following morning drive to hunting camp (7 hour drive).
- There is a option to charter a plane from Harare to Naivasha and then drive to Moz camp (5 hours).
